AdoptUSKids Names Deborah Motley Caseworker of the Month

(Port Charlotte, Florida) – AdoptUSKids named Deborah Motely, a post adoption case manager with Lutheran Services Florida in Port Charlotte, its January Caseworker of the Month. This award is part of AdoptUSKids' national initiative to celebrate caseworkers for their dedication to children and families.

For her ability to retain families by engaging them on a personal level while comporting herself as a professional, Tracey and Joseph Codd-Lorenz nominated Motley for AdoptUSKids' Caseworker of the Month.

The Codd-Lorenz family, also of Port Charlotte, said Motley supported them, alleviated their fears, and made them feel that no matter how long it took, they could depend on having somebody on their side.

"She just has a way of planting both feet in the ground," Tracey Codd-Lorenz said of Motley. While noting she has met other excellent caseworkers, Motley knew just what to do. "If not for her, we would have tossed the idea [of adopting] aside."

Thousands of foster, adoptive, and kinship families across the U.S. rely on their caseworkers every day to connect them to vital services while offering support and guidance. More than 250,000 children in the U.S. enter the foster care system every year. While more than half of these children will return to their parents, the remainder will stay in the system. Each year more than 20,000 children age out of the foster care without being adopted.

Today there are 401,000 children in foster care with approximately 104,000 of them who are available for adoption.

AdoptUsKids' Project Director Kathy Ledesma said, "Deborah Motley is a shining example of the excellent work that public and private child welfare agency caseworkers do everyday across the United States."

Motley said she is excited to be AdoptUSKids' Caseworker of the Month. She began her career in social work with the state of Florida in 1989, but moved into child welfare in 1998.

"My biggest calling was to do something with children," she said. "Then I got into adoptions, and I found that more gratifying, getting children permanency, making lasting connections with families."
