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

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
Stages of support group development



Common pain points that can cause disengagement

- Defining the who, the how, and the why for the group
- Doing too much with too little
- Challenging personalities
- Changes in leadership
- Navigating an individual or group crisis
- When an individual's needs exceed what the group can provide





The effect of the pandemic

- Virtual groups are not for everyone
- Attendance or group momentum may have been impacted
- Needs of the group may have changed

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Using data to rejuvenate your group


Add small efforts to collect data as you lead your groups:

- Ongoing needs assessments
- Satisfaction surveys
- Exit surveys
- Pre- and post-group success metrics

Reviewing your data

Do you need to create sub-groups?

- Parenting adults
- Parenting young children
- Single parents
- A new leader or co-leader? New location?
- In-person vs. virtual?



How accessible is your group?

What skills or resources do people need to access your group?

- Technological skills; highspeed internet; a computer or tablet
- Access to transportation
- Access to childcare
- Leisure time

Are there unspoken rules of belonging in your group?

- How easy is it for newcomers to feel included?
- Are some members isolated within the group?
- How are group dynamics impacting how the group functions?

Can people of various cultures and personalities show up authentically?

- What does your group feel like if you are a person of color? A younger parent/ caregiver? An introvert?
- Does the leader have the facilitation skills to ensure that dominant personalities don't overtake the group?



The importance of tending to group dynamics

- Set the tone
- Balance "I-We-It"
- Anticipate the roles participants take
- Model reflective communication

If you have one or two group members who are negatively impacting the group, it is better to have a hard conversation with them than to lose the entire group.






How do you, as a leader, affect your support group?

Strategies to breathe life back into your group


- Recruit new members
